Testing was completed at all plants daily.

Samples required by DEC and DOH were submitted to the lab.

All of the seasonal water services in Blue Mt and Indian Lake were turned on for the summer.

Hydrants were flushed in both Indian Lake and Blue Mt.

We put new tool boxes, a beacon light, and a radio in our new GMC.

Rob Streeter from DEC came to the sewer plant to do an annual inspection.

We went to Tupper Lake to get a load of D.E. for the Blue Mt Lake water plant.

The water main and all of the service lines had to be marked on Durant Rd. The County Highway is doing a major road project and we are working with them to make sure all our valves and valve boxes are in order before the road is repaved.

The curb stop had to be dug up and replaced for the Blue Canoe in Blue Mt.

The valve box for the first hydrant on Durant Rd had to be dug up and replaced.

The dam was greased and adjusted to level, and we checked to make sure everything was tight and working correctly.

The generator at the old water plant in Indian Lake had not been running in a while, so we checked it over and got it running again.

May 5, 2016 – June 8, 2016

BLUE MT. REST ROOMS: Cleaned and resupplied run every Monday – Friday. Opened and closed Blue Mountain dam when needed.

HEALTH CENTER: Built new flower box around flag pole, turned on air conditioner unit for season, thawed out unit after it was left on all night. Went with John Phillips to service AC unit. Changed bulbs and balusters.

LIBRARY: Hauled old computers to Transfer station, fixed leak in men's room, met with Ernie Pollman about locations of book drop boxes, 1 in Blue Mountain and 1 in Indian Lake, met with Blue Mountain firemen to see about location of drop box.

B.T.I.: Everything has been done 2 or 3 times, get checking hot spots will treat till permit runs out. Bruce, Bill and Tim went to Albany for a recertification class.

SKI HUT: Changed bulbs and fixed front door lock.

TOWN HALL: Repainted handicapped parking lines, Health Center was done also. Met with Julie about lifeguards, set up meeting to start season.

COURT PROJECT: Finished putting siding on gable. Put 3 new windows in. Cleaned up scrap pieces and took to transfer station. Repaired 2 vents and painted to use on gable end of building. Waiting on rest of materials to be delivered.

BYRON PARK: Put up new pieces of fence by boat launch. Fixed lead in women's bathroom. Put up big electric box in Pavilion. Kurt Locke started working weekends.

EVENTS: Put up Town Wide Garage sale banner at Byron Park, 3 prepare to stop signs, 8 picnic tables and 6 barricades to fire hall for benefit. Put up Black Fly Challenge banner at Byron Park. Met with Cycle Adirondacks at school to see where we are going to set up power and water. Put up across Park Challenge sign at Pines.

EQUIPMENT REPAIR: Put new brakes and U joint on '08 dump truck, helped Bill. Repaired door at Ambulance garage, new cables and put back on track. Put new wheels on mower deck, took 318 JD tractor #1 to Glens Falls to repair leak in hydro pump.

BLUE MTN. MOWING: Mowed and weedeated Blue Mtn. Cemetery, Rec. lot, old garage, fire hall beach, bench, 3 town signs, water plant, transfer station 2 so far.

CHAMBER: Turned on water under building and put air conditioner in for season, put 4 by 4 post in for drop box.

ABANAKEE LAKE: Repaired and put buoys back on and put line across in front of dam. Did the same thing in front of Adirondack Lake dam.

BLUE MT. TRANSFER STATION: Mowed, weedeated twice. Fred opened for season. Got a hold of Eric about picking up metal bin.

INDIAN LAKE MUSEUM: Turned water and power and hung out sign for season. Took old toilet out and put new one in.

MEALSITE: Fixed gutters and leak in hot water line. Painted handicap lines.

TRANSFER STATION: Put new mower deck on Husky tractor, had Josh cover for 2 days on Town trash day.

INDIAN LAKE MOWING: Mowed Town hall, Legion hall, Health Center, Museum, Little League field, Library, Benton Cemetery, 3 town signs, old water plant, old sewer plant, Ruben Rist gravesite, Chain Lakes 3 times so far, did shooting range, Byron Park, Ski hut, Catholic Cemetery, Cedar River Cemetery, Old transfer station, Chamber, Mini Park, 2 Big chairs twice so far.

TREE REMOVAL: Cut blowdown tree out of Benton Rd on a Friday when Highway Department was off.

RESOLUTION # 9 – 2016

Resolution in support of Congresswoman Stefanik's Bills expressing the commitment of the U.S. House of Representatives to work to combat the nationwide problem of Invasive Species, as well as providing the issuance of a Semi - Postal Stamp to help fund this initiative.

WHEREAS, approximately 50,000 nonnative invasive animal and plant species have been introduced to the United States, resulting in national economic costs estimated at more than \$1000,000,000 annually, and Adirondack region costs up to \$9000,000,000 annually, **and**

WHEREAS, Congresswoman Stefanik's first bill, expressing commitment of the U. S. House of Representatives to work constructively to create a comprehensive solution to the threat of invasive species, by controlling and eradicating established invasive species populations and preventing the further introduction of nonnative species into native ecosystems, **and**

WHEREAS, the second Bill would create a Semi - Postal stamp to be known as the Combating Invasive Species Semi - Postal Stamp to provide much needed funding for programs to combat invasive species, **NOW THEREFORE BE IT**



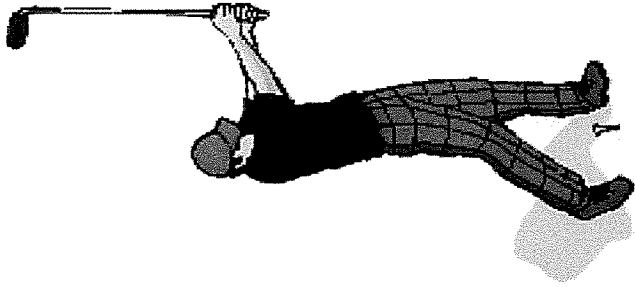

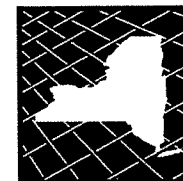

All of us at Mercy Flight Central are pleased to inform you that we have begun permanent operations at Griffiss International Airport.


