JULY 2016

Materials continue to be hauled for summer projects.

Winter road sand has been hauled to Blue Mt. Lake.

The lower Stanton Road project went well. The entire road has been undercut; rocks were removed and hauled away. The disrupted areas from last years waterline project were top soiled and new culverts were put in. Bartons' Dust was added to the surface and Item #4 will be added as soon as we have enough materials hauled.

Joe Locke Road is being undercut now. The base material in that road is very bad. It's going to get a cob rock topping before we add item #4. This project is going to take a considerable amount of time due to the number of large rocks and the amount of material that is going to have to be added to the surface to make it stronger.

Mowing is being done when possible. Crow Hill, Stanton, White Birch Lane and King Roads have been brushed with the excavator mower.

Our new loader arrived and is being used on the Joe Locke Road.

Flags were straightened out before the 4th of July weekend.

Report for June 2016

Testing was completed at all plants daily.

Samples required by DEC and DOH were submitted to the lab.

A one inch service was put in at Binders Cabins to provide water to some of the cabins there.

We replaced all of the valve boxes on Durrant Road because the County is working on the road and we want all of our stuff in order for when they repave.

Bud Hayes was having a low pressure issue in Blue Mt, so we went to his house to help solve the problem.

We had our annual inspection from DOH at both water plants.

We dug up the six inch water main we put in last year on Stanton Rd to have Glen Davis come to do a live tap so we could put a hydrant near the end of the six inch main.

We had the iron and manganese sludge hauled from the Indian Lake water plant to the sewer plant to the drying bed.

The left train at the sewer plant was transferred to the right train, we had sludge hauled away, and we cleaned the left train.

There was a leak out on the golf course that they could not locate, so we went there and helped them find the leak.

We had two VFD's (Variable Frequency Drive) installed at the East Plant. One of the electric motors was too old to be wired to the VFD so we replaced it with a new electric motor.

All of the water bills for both districts were mailed out.

Blue Mt. Rest Rooms: Cleaned and resupplied every Mon - Fri, opened and closed B.M. dam when needed.

Health Center: put new bulbs in downstairs light replaced ballast in Exam room light.

Imh Garage: met with Vincent heating and showed them the heating system layout. worked on heat problem.

Blue Mt Mowing: mowed and weedeated, BM Cemetery, Rec. lot, Old Garage Beach, Bench, Fire Hall, 3 town signs, water plant, water tanks trans. Station 2 this month.

I.L. Mowing: mowed and weedeated, Benton Cemetery, Cedar River Cemetery Catholic Cemetery, Towns Complex, Roben Rist, Chain Lakes 3 town signs. Ski Hut, chamber, mini Park, Little League field, Byron Park, Old Trans Station, old water plant, old sewer plant

IL mowing: new water plant, shooting range, 2 big chairs.

3.M. Tran St: cut blown down tree out of road.

I.L. Tran St: made a new no brush sign to see if we can stop people from dumping brush. put new battery in Josh's mower.

Town Garage: replaced broken window and cut tree out of chain lakes road.

Equip. Repair: picked up 318 John Deere mower #1 from Glens Falls after a healthy repair. Serviced tractors after weekly mowing. repaired weedeaters.
