Work continues on Joe Locke Road. The base in this road continues to be very bad, some places it was topsoil on the top 3 feet. In these places we had to dig it out and replace it with better material. We also continue to top the road with cob rock to strengthen the base. It has to be covered with Barton Mines dust to give it a smoother driving surface.

Chip seal was applied on the half mile of Parkerville that was undercut last year and also on the area on John Rust Road that was undercut last year also. Stanton Road and White Birch Lane had a single coat of chip seal applied to seal the base coat of blacktop that was put down two years ago.

Some roads have been graded when time allows us to leave Joe Locke Road with the grader. Dry conditions have made some dirt roads rough.

Town of Indian Lake water and wastewater

Report for April 2016

Testing was completed at all plants daily.

Samples required by DEC and DOH were submitted to the lab.

The dam broke on July fourth weekend, and had to have a complete overhaul. We put all new parts in whatever could be replaced. We have also been checking the dam and adjusting it weekly to help stay ahead of any problems.

About 320 feet of our sewer force main was replaced behind the Frontier building. The existing line is cast iron but we put in fusible HDPE (high density poly ethylene) because it is plastic and once it is fused together there are no joints in the pipe.

Last month when we installed the new VFD’s at the East plant we had to change one of the electric motors because it was so old. We ended up changing the other electric motor this month because it wasn’t working.

Charlie Rawson from Cedarwood Engineering came up one day to help us fix the programming for the VFD’s because we were having some issues with them.

One of our sewer pumps at the East plant wore out and had to be replaced. We also had to replace one of the floats that tell the pumps when to turn on.

Some of the hydrants were flushed in Indian Lake.

There was a leak on Stanton Rd down by the hydrant that was put in earlier this year. The clamp was leaking where we had it live tapped and had to be dug up and tightened.

PARKS AND REC. MONTHLY REPORT
July 6, 2016 – Aug. 3, 2016

BLUE MT. REST ROOMS: Cleaned and resupplied every Monday – Friday. Opened and closed Blue Mountain dam when needed. Replaced broken boards outside building.

HEALTH CENTER: Replaced lights and balusters in Carol's office. Put new outlet in doctor's office and repaired leaking toilet.

LIBRARY: Took truck load of old books to transfer station. Fixed toilet at Library, put new parts in back. Took load of old computer parts to transfer station.

SKI HUT: Mowed and weedeated front lawn, banks, side of road and around skating rink. Helped Schrade pump out septic tank. Set up electric boxes, tents, tables and garbage cans for music in the rink.

TOWN HALL: Put new lock in men's bathroom.

COURT PROJECT: helped Ken finish all outside work and picked up all leftover materials and tools. Cleaned up outside building.

BYRON PARK: Put new soap dispensers in back bathrooms, raked and leveled horse shoe pits and painted pins. Repaired front porch railing on log building, repaired logs on septic pump building. Fixed toilets and replaced bulbs in log building. Repaired canoe launch dock in back of Byron Park. Fixed vacuum, sign and toilet paper dispensers. Covered days, night, weekends when Kurt was off sick. Spoke to Kurt on several occasions about his work effort. Sent him home twice.

EVENTS: Put up banners and signs for Fireworks, Adk. Challenge, Music at the Ski Hut and Byron Park. Put popcorn machine together, picked up golf carts, moved tables, set up electric boxes, garbage cans, beer truck, tents, popup tents, pulled beaver dam and built bridge for horse's on snowmobile trail. Barricaded for events and roads. Took county barricades back to Lake Pleasant. Picked up after every event. Put up Town Wide Garage sale banner at Byron Park, 3 prepare to stop signs, 8 picnic tables and 6 barricades to fire hall for benefit. Put up Black Fly Challenge banner at Byron Park. Met with Cycle Adirondacks at school to see where we are going to set up power and water. Put up across Park Challenge sign at Pines.

EQUIPMENT REPAIR: Serviced 318 JD tractors, cleaned out van. Changed oil and serviced black Chevy pickup. Serviced husky lawn tractor. Got bulldozer running for Water and Sewer to use. Took grey Chevy pickup to Warrensburgh for repairs one week after it got ran into in Ski Hut parking lot after yoga class.

BLUE MTN. MOWING: Mowed and weedeated Blue Mtn. Cemetery, Rec. lot, old garage, fire hall beach, bench, 3 town signs, water plant, transfer station 2 so far. Fixed wash outs on Cemetery Road. Put new backboard and rim on tennis court at rec. lot. Mowed Catholic Cemetery banks.

ABANAKEE LAKE: picked up garbage every Mon. – Fri. Fixed buoy lines, put in kiddie pool line. Repaired lock in men's room door. Fixed leaking toilet.

MEALSITE: Put new bulbs and balusters in lights.

TRANSFER STATION: Made and put up 4 new signs, fixed weight in machine, took flat loader tire off and helped Bill change tire. Located 4 new used tires and went and picked them up. Will change them when we have time.

INDIAN LAKE MOWING: Mowed Town hall, Legion hall, Health Center, Museum, Little League field, Library, Benton Cemetery, 3 town signs, old water plant, old sewer plant, Ruben Rist gravesite, Chain Lakes 3 times so far, did shooting range, Byron Park, Ski hut, Catholic Cemetery, Cedar River Cemetery, Old transfer station, Chamber, Mini Park, 2 Big chairs and Abanakee Beach two times so far.
